A SCAM CLOSER TO HOME

Please be aware that, at least, one of our fellow Lion's name is being used, to extort money, from the unsuspecting. Apparently, the scammer, purporting to be the fellow Lion is asking people to buy vouchers, for them, with the promise of a refund. It is a very unusual request so, **PLEASE CHECK THE EMAIL ADDRESS VERY VERY CAREFULLY.** If you do get any out of character messages, with links or, request, from someone, on your contact list, give them a phone call (Don't email), to verify or deny the message. Unfortunately, it is all too easy for scammers to 'spoof' an email address, without the owner knowing.

Also there are other messages, doing the rounds, saying that the recipients emails are being stopped unless they press a key or open a document. Doing this will lead you to a site, where the scammers will steal personal details or download malware onto your PC.

The best way to deal with these, is to just delete them from your PC or, if you have time, forward the message to Action Fraud and, then delete them.


