"ROYAL MAIL" SCAM EMAIL

There is an email, doing the rounds, among others, purporting to be from the The Royal Mail, advising that they could not deliver a parcel.

It says that there is ± 2.95 to pay otherwise, in 48 hours, the parcel will be returned to sender. You are asked to click a link, within the email.

Clicking on the link, will take you to a site, where they will attempt to get personal information from you.

One dead giveaway, is the sender's email address, which is of the format: **'royal-mail-online-support-info-user-centerJohan.valke@telenet.be'** The name, in the address line can vary and, you may also see a lack of punctuation, in the message.

Generally, if Royal Mail cannot deliver, for any reason, they will put a card through your letterbox, advising where the parcel can be collected from.
