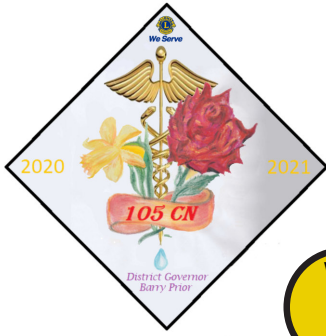

**DIABETES TYPE 2 PREVENTION WEEK - 10<sup>th</sup> TO 16<sup>th</sup> MAY 2021**

**WORLD DIABETES DAY - 14<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER 2021.**

There are 12.3 million people in the UK at increased risk of developing type 2 diabetes. But for many people there are steps that can be taken to reduce the risk, three in five cases of type 2 diabetes can be prevented or delayed.

We as Lions can help people in the community to reduce the risk even at this time with restrictions in place even though we cannot meet face to face. Education is the main way. This can be done by publicising on your social media sites and websites to raise public awareness about the risk.

It is very quick and easy to use and will offer advice if found to be at high risk, there is a wealth of information available on the Diabetes UK website or a call to their helpline can provide valuable assistance.
